

Razom Welcomes Resumption of U.S. Aid to Ukraine

Russia has always been the obstacle to peace—not Ukraine. It is sorely-needed good news that the United States is resuming life-saving military assistance and intelligence sharing with Ukraine, and that Washington and Kyiv are ready to push Moscow to implement a 30-day ceasefire. For three years, the onus to make peace and stop fighting is on Russia, not Ukraine. Today is no different.

It's time for President Donald Trump to put Maximum Pressure on Vladimir Putin and force him to stop Russia's daily war crimes and bombing of civilians. A ceasefire is an excellent opportunity for President Trump to push Putin to return the more than 19,546 Ukrainian children that Russia has abducted, as well as other hostages being held by the Kremlin.

Ukrainians want peace more than anyone—they are paying the price of Russia's war crimes each day. U.S. assistance to Ukraine saves lives and gives President Trump leverage over Russia. The Trump administration should double down on this win by ensuring a ceasefire results in lasting peace that guarantees Ukraine's security and frees Ukraine's stolen people.
